Position Overview

The law clerk reports directly to the judge and is primarily responsible for conducting legal research, advising the judge on legal matters, preparing bench memos, drafting orders and opinions, editing and proof reading the judge's orders and opinions, verifying citations, prepare pre-hearing/trial case summaries and attending trials and other court proceedings.

Qualifications

To qualify, eligible candidates must have graduated from an accredited law school a strong academic background, membership (in good standing) with a State Bar and at least two years of full-time post J.D. legal experience. A strong work ethic, and excellent organizational, communication and research/writing skills requested. Applicant must possess proficient typing and computer skills, ability to work with strict deadlines within a fast-paced environment and ability to work independently or as a team player.
